¿Cuándo usar el Past Simple?



El Past Simple en inglés se usa para hablar de:

- Acciones completadas o finalizadas en el pasado. La acción comenzó y terminó en el pasado.
- Una acción completada tras otra.
- Un hábito pasado o eventos regulares del pasado.

The Stone Age **lasted** from around 2.5 million years ago to about 5,000 years ago.

Early humans **developed** the skill of making fire and later **discovered** how to create tools from stone.

The Stone Age humans **lived** in caves for shelter and **had** a primitive and rugged appearance.

Formando el Past Simple

Verbos Regulares



Añadimos -ed al verbo para formar el Past Simple regular.

Cuando el verbo termina en consonante + y, este cambia a -ied

like - liked	stay - stayed
visit - visited	study - studied

Pronunciación:

Cuando un verbo termina en un sonido sordo, la terminación -ed se pronuncia como /t/, sin añadir una sílaba extra.	t like - liked
Cuando un verbo termina en un sonido sonoro, la terminación -ed se pronuncia como /d/, sin añadir una sílaba extra.	d stay - stayed
Cuando un verbo termina en los sonidos /t/ o /d/, se añade una sílaba extra con la pronunciación /ɪd/.	Id want - wanted

Verbos Irregulares

Estos son solo algunos ejemplos de verbos irregulares en el Past Simple:

be	was,were
have	had
meet	met
buy	bought
go	went
make	made
do	done
break	broke



Past Simple Sentences

Affirmative Sentences

ESTRUCTURA

Subject + Past Simple Verb + Complement

I **played** soccer yesterday

They **went** to the park last Sunday

She **was** a really good student



Negative Sentences

ESTRUCTURA

Subject + did not (didn't) + Base Verb + Complement

I **did not played** soccer yesterday

They **didn't went** to the park last Sunday

She **wasn't** a really good student



Interrogative Sentences

ESTRUCTURA

Did + Subject + Base Verb + Complement + ?

Did you **play** soccer yesterday?

Did they go to the park last Sunday?

Was she a really good student?



Time Expressions

- **Yesterday:** "I saw him yesterday."
- **Last week/month/year:** "She visited her grandparents last week."
- **In 2010/1995/etc.:** "They bought a house in 2010."
- **When:** "When I was a child, I used to play in the park."
- **Ago:** "I finished the project two days ago."
