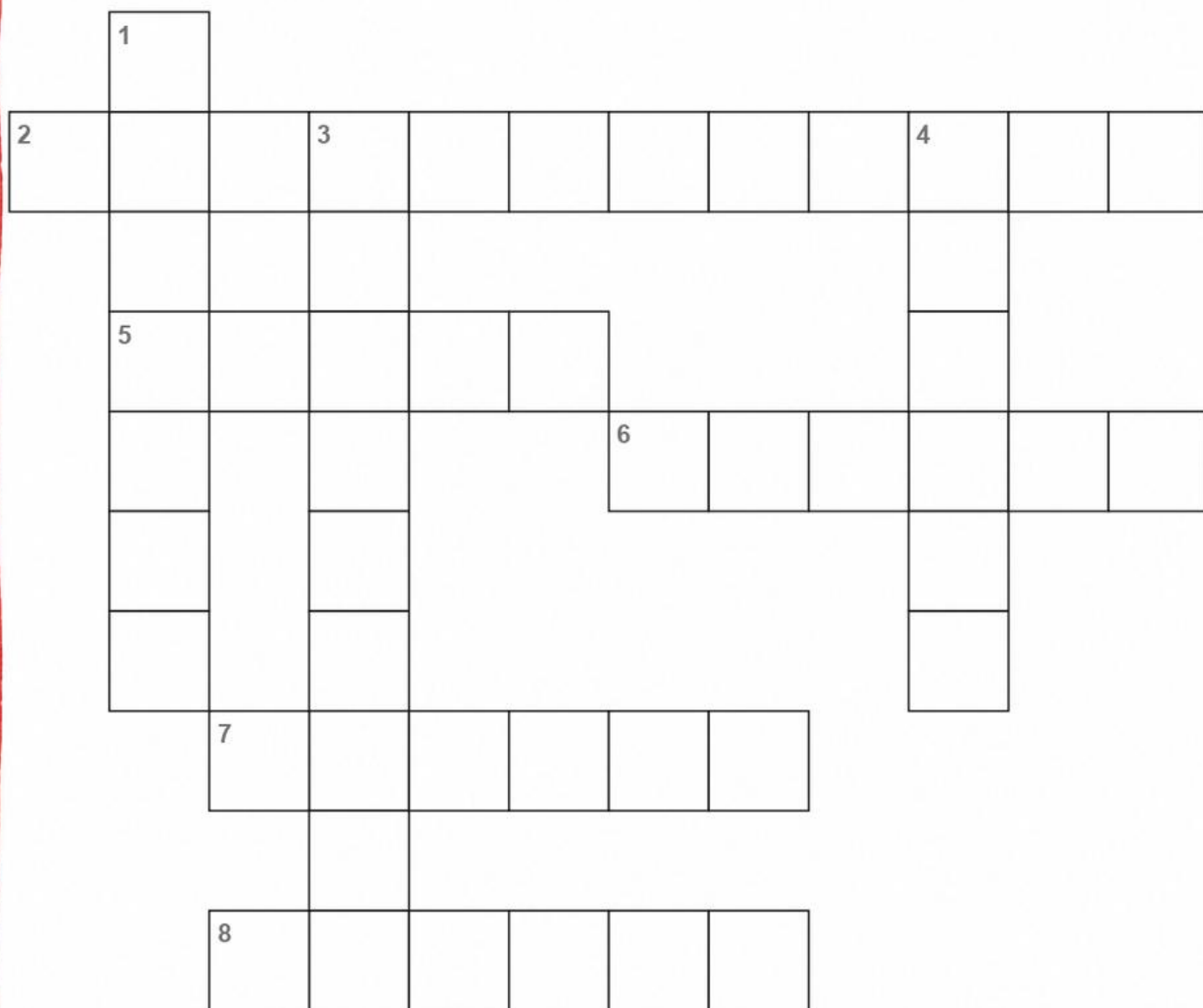

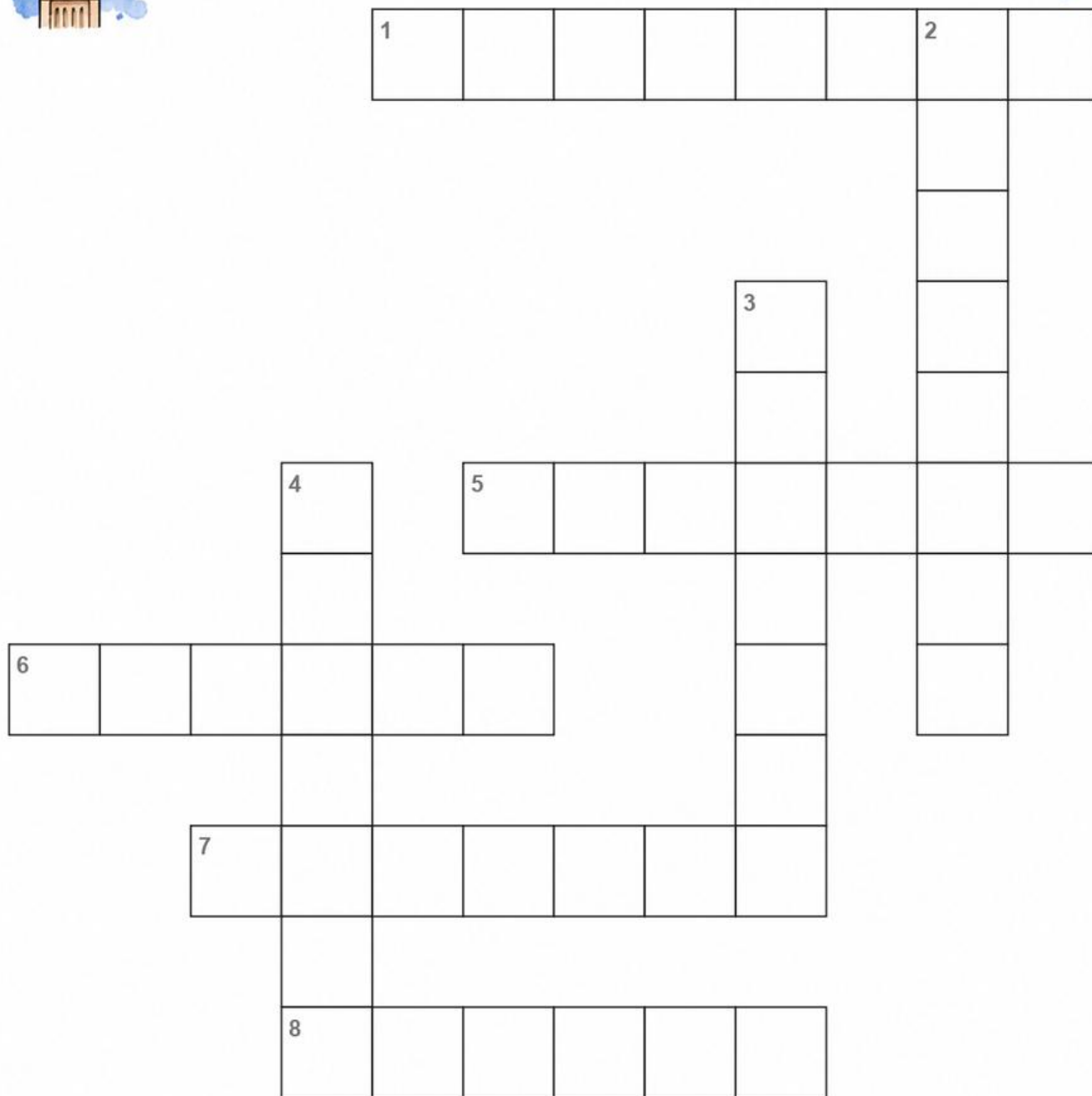
1. A boy who has the same parents as you.

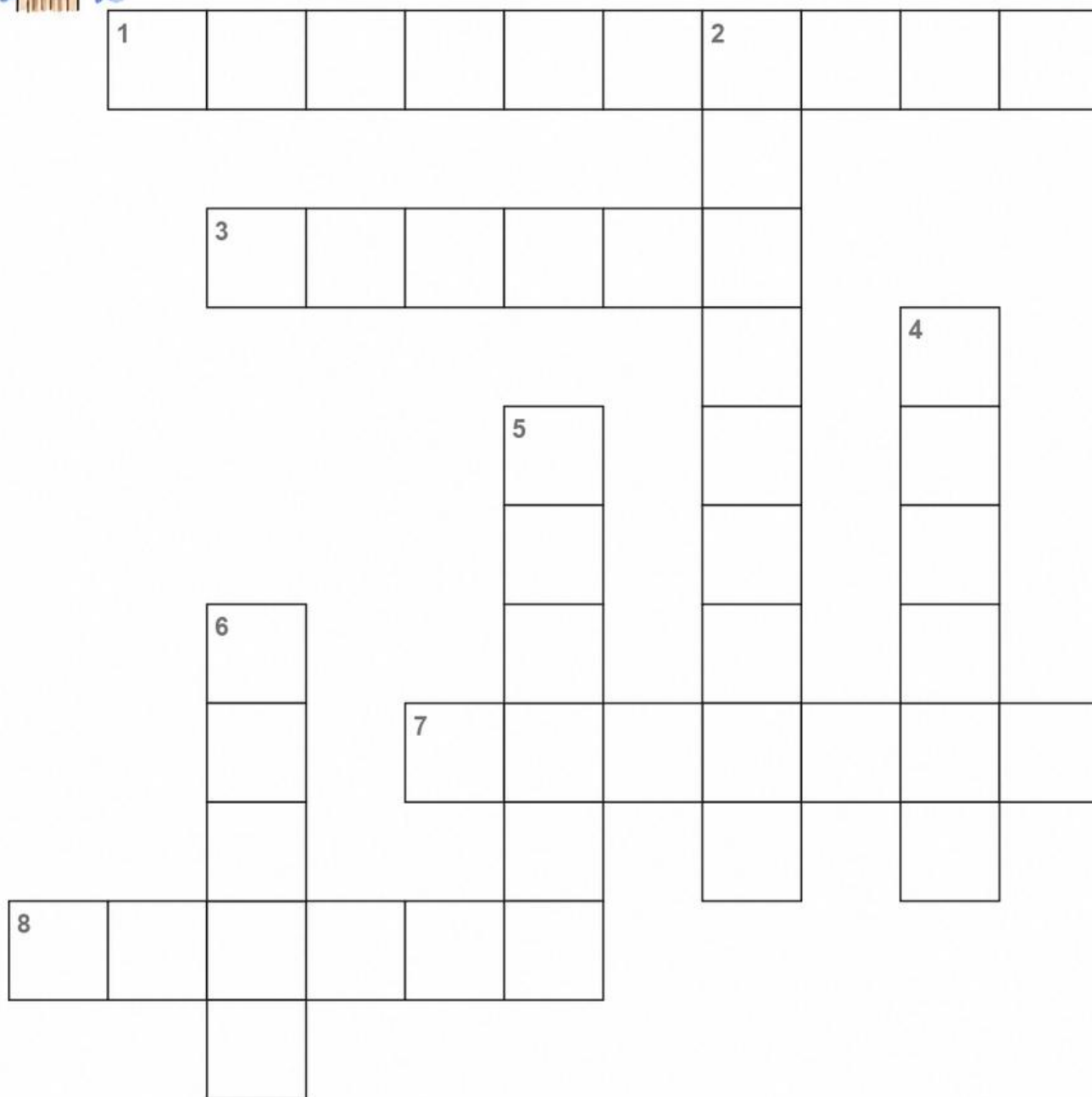

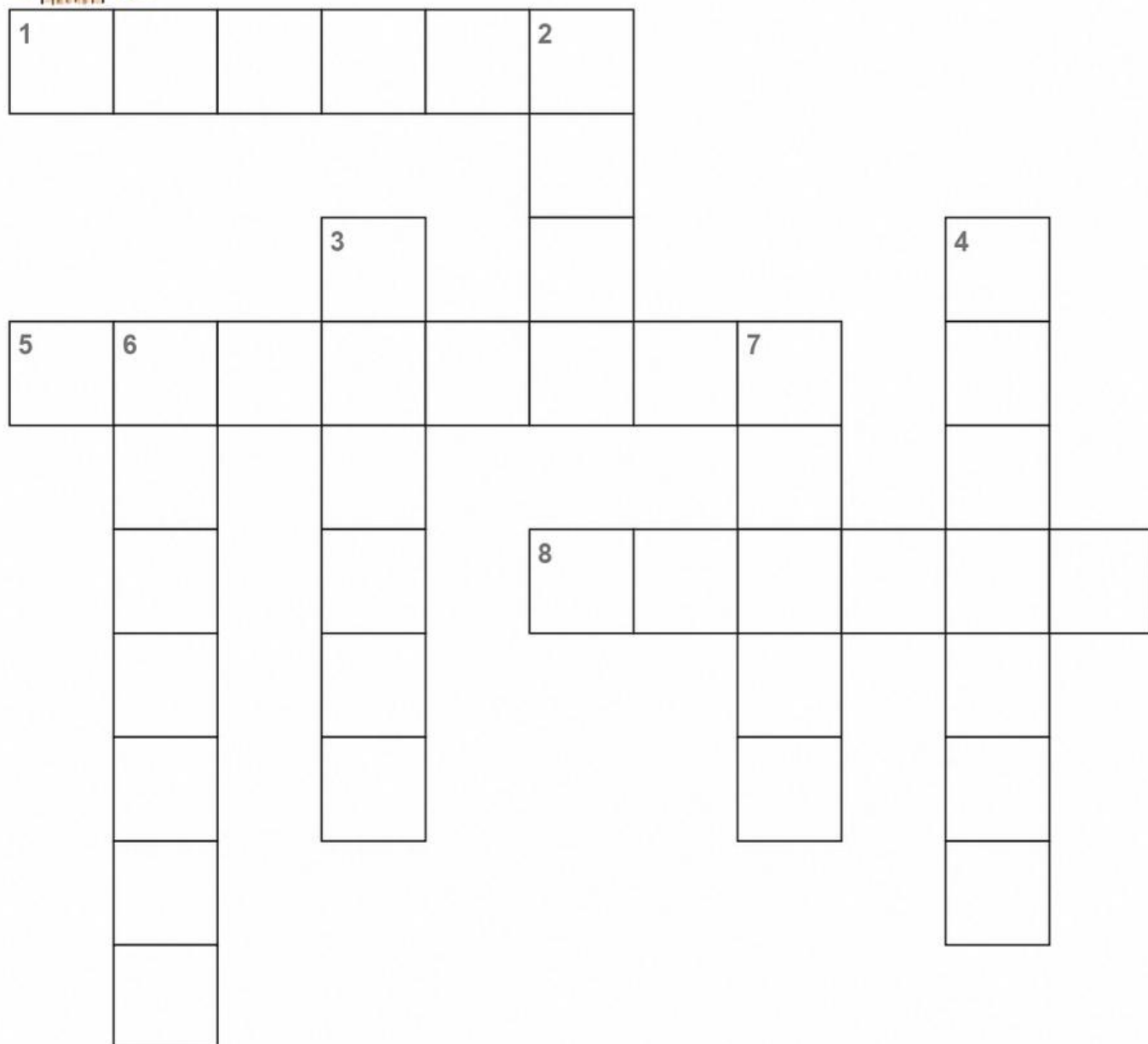
2. The first meal of the day.

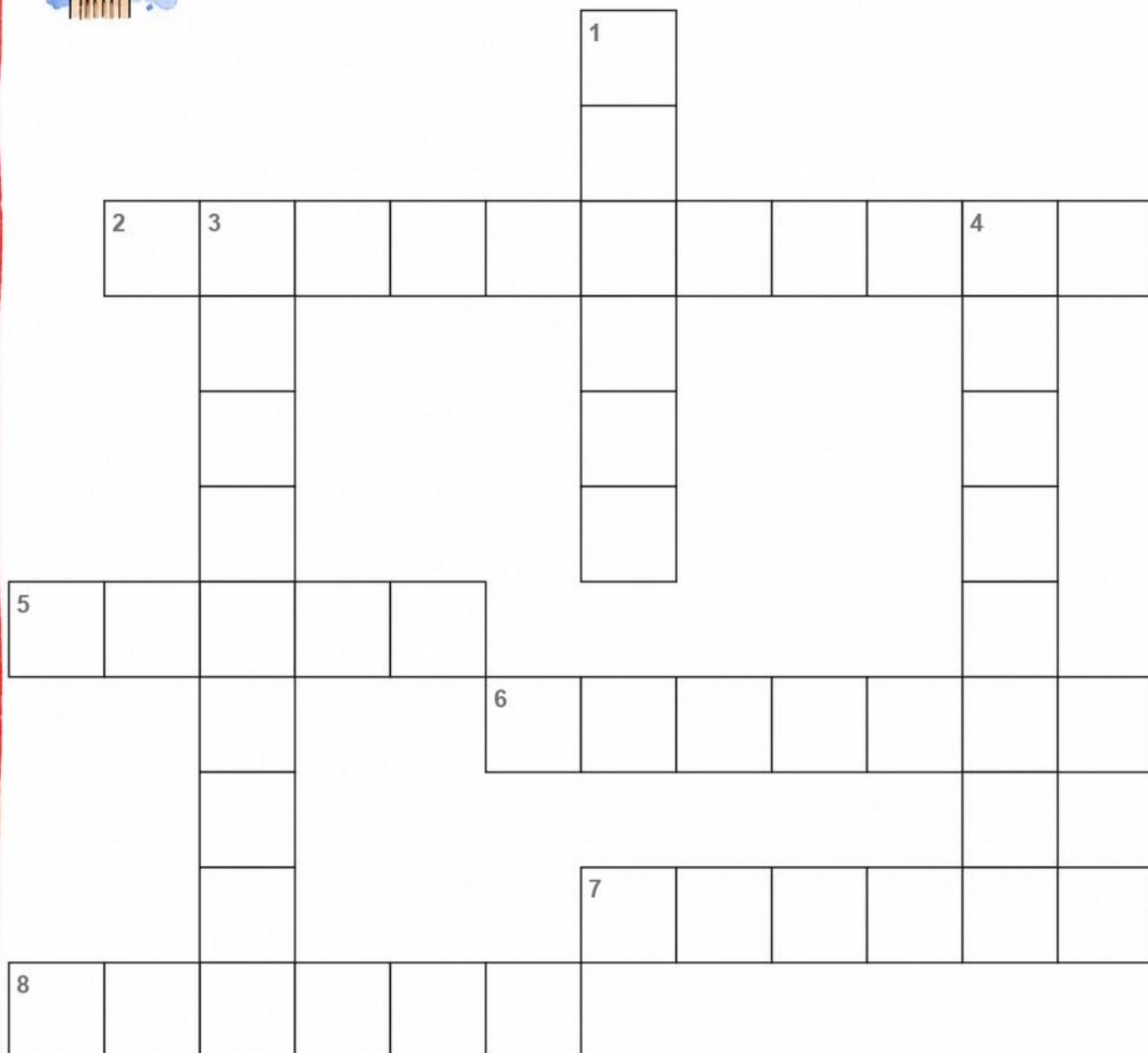
2. It tells you if the clothes are small, medium or large.

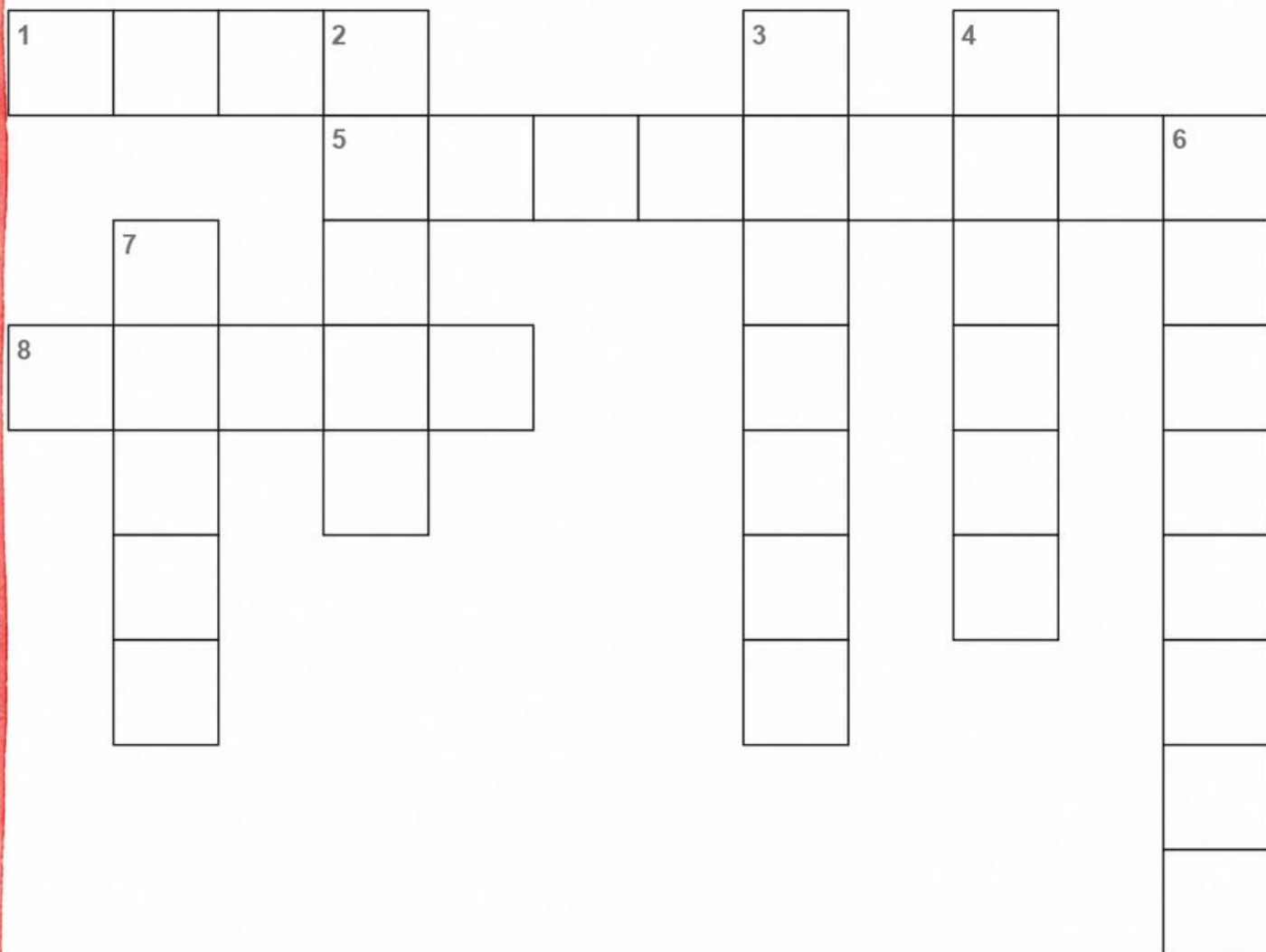

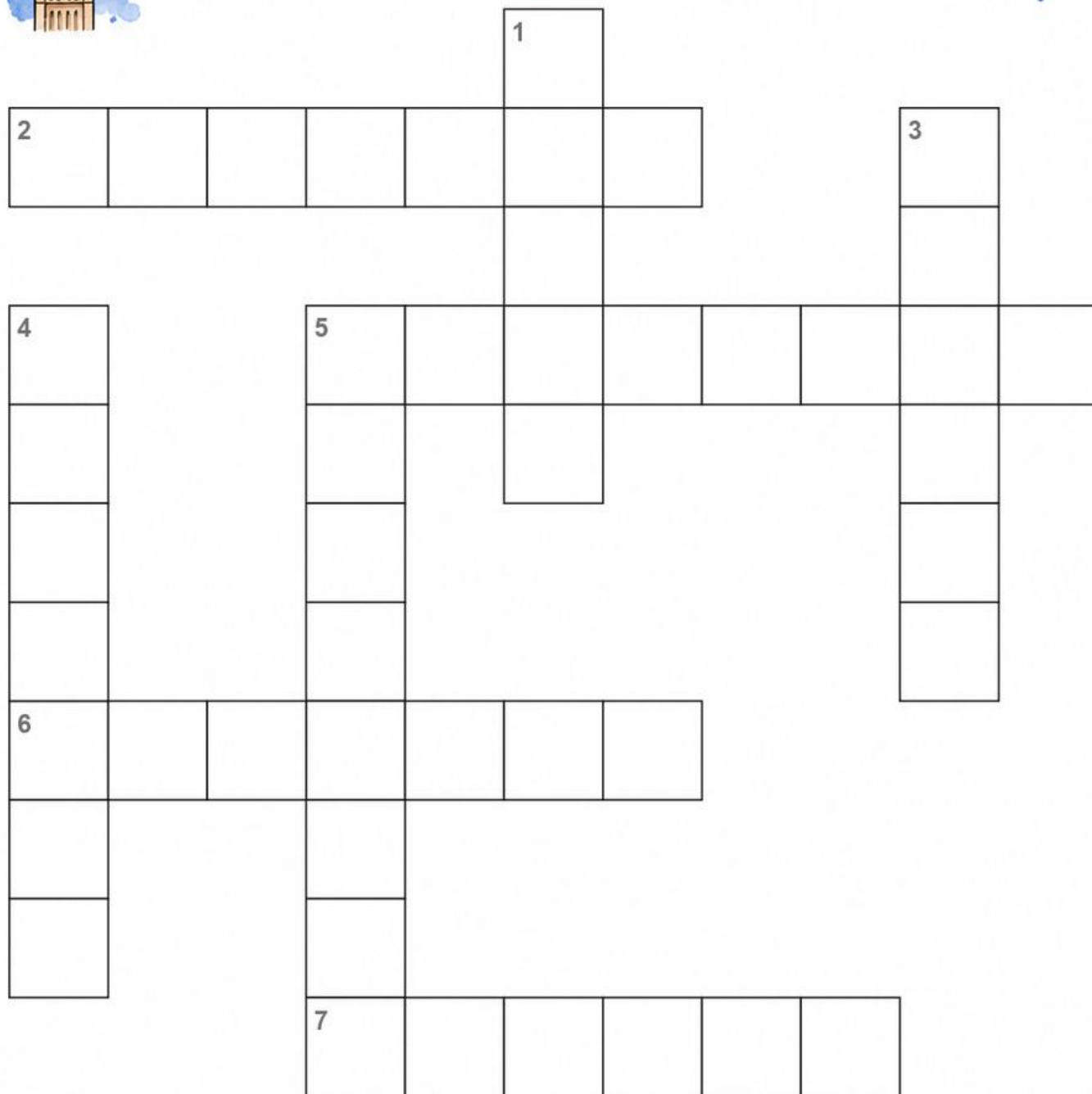
- 2. A game between two teams or two players.

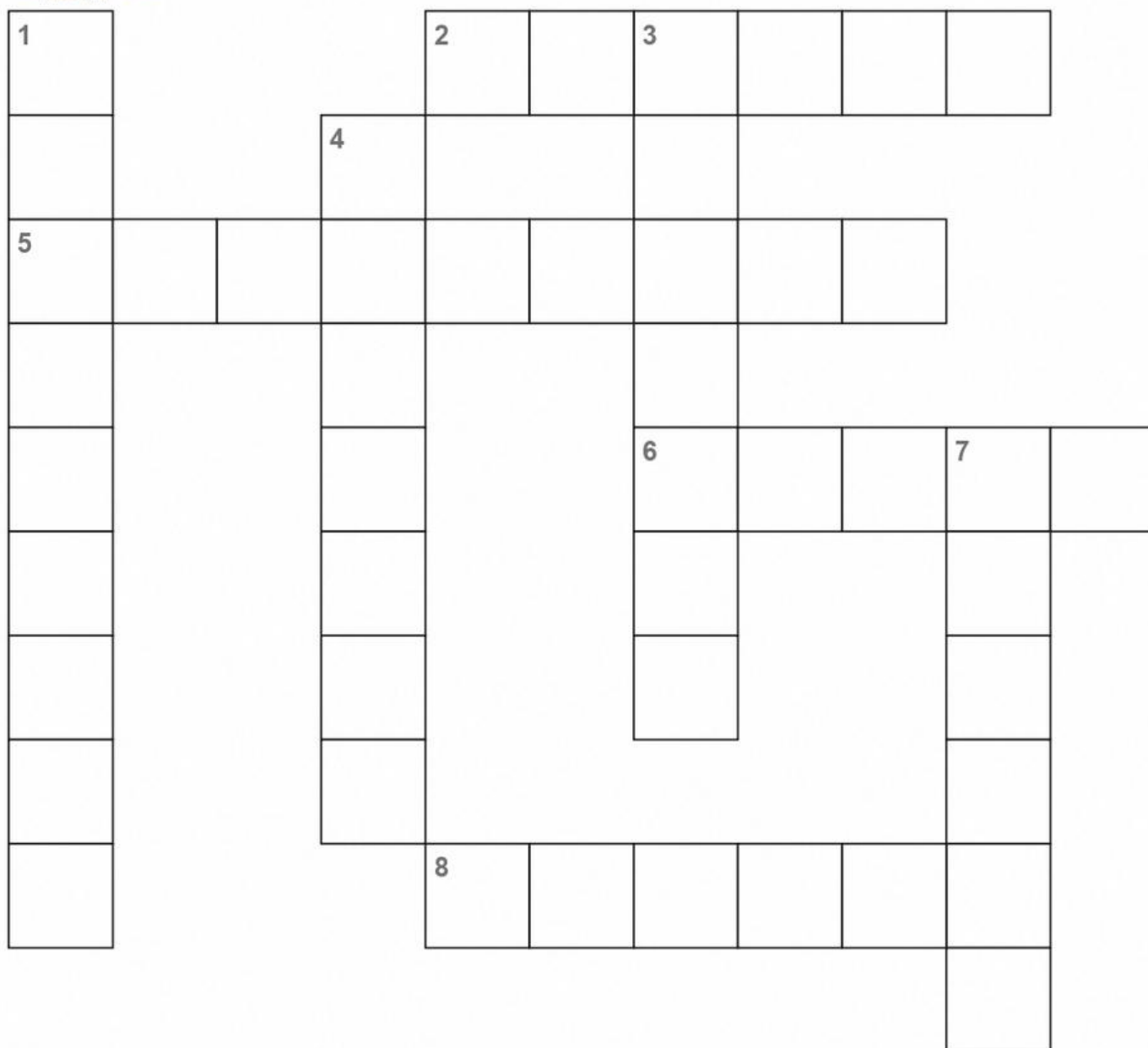
1. When your flight or your train is later than expected.

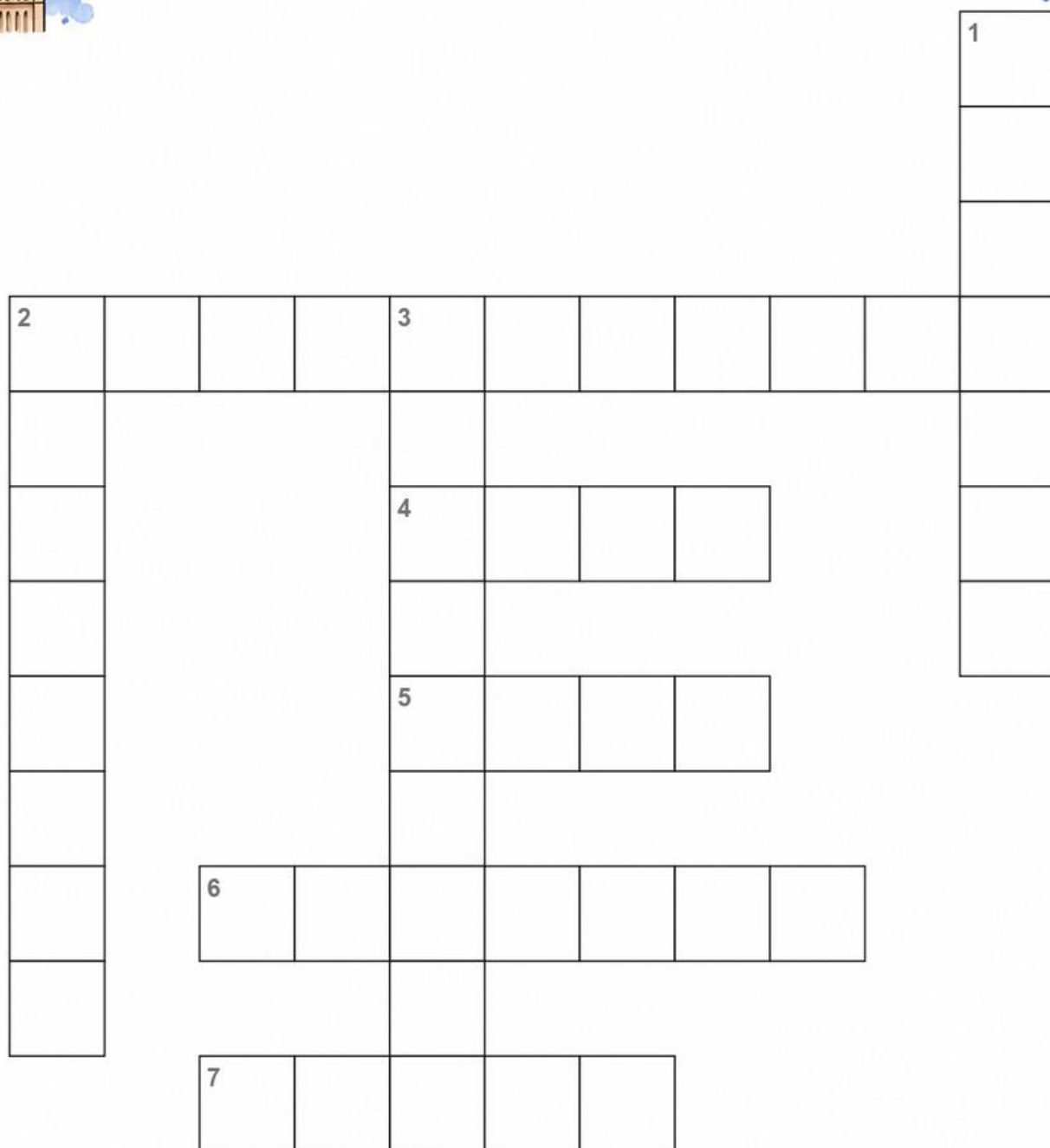
- 1. Dirty air, water or soil caused by human activity.

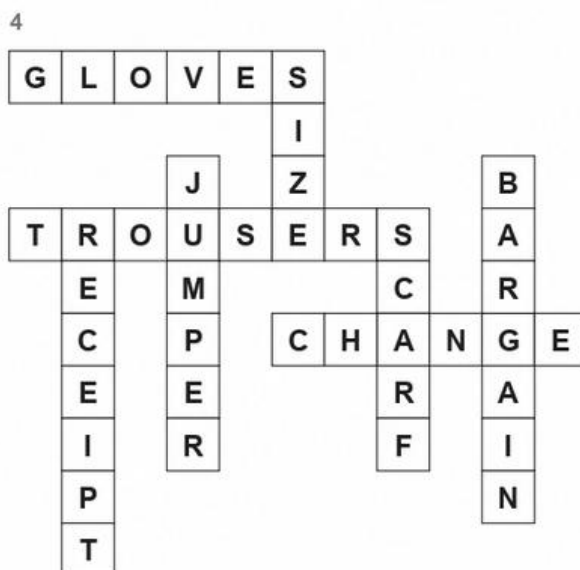

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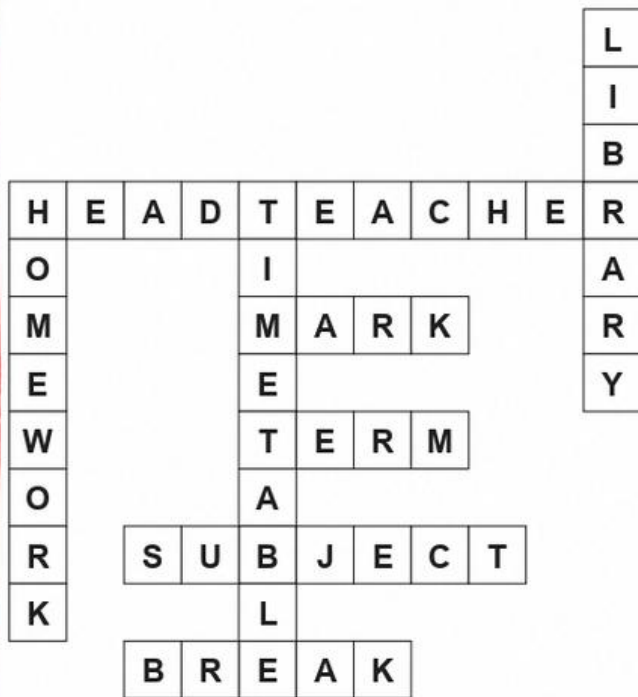
